Students may select any designated I-Series (SCIS) course under the prefix of ARTH, ARCH, ARTT, ENGL, MUSC and THET. I-Series courses that do not begin with these prefixes will require approval of the program director BEFORE enrolling in the course. Some I-Series courses will not be accepted as an 'arts' supporting course.

**Any one of the three capstone courses will fulfill a Scholarship in Practice (DSSP) GenEd requirement.*

¹ Students may petition an alternative course to the Arts program director. Such a petition must include rationale for the selection of the course as "arts related" and may require the student to furnish a copy of the course syllabus to the program director. Students are encouraged to take General Education courses that connect with the theme of their Scholars program.

All Arts Scholars are expected to meet the following requirements. Students will submit the checklist below when completing their Scholars Citation Review.

- _____ Model good community citizenship (confirmed with Offices of Resident Life and Student Conduct);
- _____ Comply with the University's Code of Academic Integrity (no XFs on a candidate's transcript);
- _____ Integrate your Scholars learning by satisfactorily completing a learning outcomes assessment;
- _____ Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in designated Scholars courses, including ENGL 101S²;
- _____ Complete the College Park Scholars Program Evaluation at the end of your sophomore year (online);
- _____ Complete all requirements within your first four semesters at UM; and
- _____ Complete a minimum of 21 credits as outlined below.

The accurate completion and timely submission of these documents will ensure your review for your Scholars Citation or Certificate of Completion. Upon the conclusion of your Scholars four semesters:
