**Supporting courses<sup>1</sup>**

Students must complete two (2) by the end of their fourth semester. Supporting courses are meant to deepen your appreciation of the transdisciplinary nature of Global Public Health and provide opportunities for you to connect your Scholars learning to relevant courses. Most often, supporting courses satisfy general education requirements. You must complete **two** courses from a pre-determined list. A more complete list will be distributed during orientation and again in the first colloquium.

<sup>1</sup> Students may petition an alternative course to the Global Public Health program director. Such a petition must include rationale for the selection of the course and specifically how the course will enrich understanding of Global Public Health. Students should consider petitioning any General Education “P” course that contributes to the deepening of your Scholars theme.

**Additional Requirements for a College Park Scholars Citation in  
Global Public Health:**

- \_\_\_\_\_ Model good community citizenship (confirmed with Offices of Resident Life and Student Conduct);
- \_\_\_\_\_ Comply with the University's Code of Academic Integrity (no XFs on a candidate's transcript);
- \_\_\_\_\_ Participate in the College Park Scholars Academic Showcase;
- \_\_\_\_\_ Integrate your Scholars learning by satisfactorily completing a learning outcomes assessment;
- \_\_\_\_\_ Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in all UM coursework<sup>2</sup>;
- \_\_\_\_\_ Complete all requirements within your first four semesters at UM; and
- \_\_\_\_\_ Complete a minimum of 16 credits as outlined below.

The accurate completion and timely submission of these documents will ensure your review for your Scholars Citation or Certificate of Completion. Upon the conclusion of your Scholars four semesters:
