3. Introduction to Writing (unless exempt) (AW)

Scholars students are permitted to take any "S" section of ENGL101 offered in the fall. If students cannot fit ENGL101S into their schedule, they can take a "non-S" section of ENGL101. GPH Scholars are permitted to take ENGL101 in the spring if the schedule does not permit in the fall.
