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Practicum

Scholars in Public Leadership must complete a 3-credit practicum in the sophomore year in one of the following ways:

1. A UMD course that focuses on experiential learning (talk to PL about which courses are eligible)
2. A UMD research course
3. A UMD study abroad trip
4. A UMD course that gives you credit for sustained service (talk to PL about which programs are eligible)
5. An internship – must be enrolled in a UMD course that gives 3 credits for internships
