Practicum

Scholars in Public Leadership must complete a 3-credit practicum in the sophomore year in one of the following ways:

1. An internship – Your internship must be at least 135 hours over the course of the semester (~8 hours a week), and must be completed during the Fall, Spring, or Summer. Additionally, you must be enrolled in CPSP339P (DSSP) or another UMD course that gives 3 credits for internships at the same time you are doing your internship.
2. A UMD research course
3. An approved UMD course that focuses on experiential learning (see below)
4. A UMD study abroad course

The practicum is a hands-on, experiential, practical opportunity to put your leadership skills to work. This is typically in the form of an internship in your career field but could also be study abroad, the application of some on-campus leadership opportunities (QUEST, RA, TA, etc.), or sometimes a handful of approved classes on campus. Once you have decided which type of practicum you want to do (experiential course, internship, research, service, or study abroad), please meet with Kelly Brower (kbrower@umd.edu) to finalize your selection.
