(unless otherwise approved i.e. spending a semester abroad); and
- \_\_\_\_\_ Complete a minimum of 17 credits as outlined below.

**Please Note:** All BSE students must take BMGT289B and CPBE225 as part of the BSE curriculum requirement. BMGT289B satisfies the (DSSP) and (SCIS) general education requirements. CPBE225 satisfies the (FSOC) general education requirement. Please take this into consideration prior to registering for general education courses.

**For Spring, 2017,** BSE students should register for BMGT110S (*Restricted to College Park Scholars in Business, Society, and the Economy*) They may also register for one of the required Supporting Courses, as per note above.
