Such petition must explain how such course will enrich the understanding of business, society and/or the economy. Director's approval must be received prior to registration for such course.</p>

3. Supporting Course(s) – Optional for first and second semester

Students may complete the one (1) required Support Course anytime during their first four (4) semesters. Please see the Scholars BSE citation sheet for a list of approved supporting courses.

For Spring 2020: All BSE students must take **BMGT110S – Introduction to Business Value Chain** (*Restricted to College Park Scholars in Business, Society and the Economy*) as part of the BSE curriculum requirement. They may also register for one of the required Supporting Courses, as per note above.

For Fall 2020: All BSE students must take CPBE225 – Enterprise Communication as part of the BSE curriculum requirement. CPBE225 satisfies the FSOC general education requirement. Please take this into consideration prior to registering for general education courses. They may also register for one of the required Supporting Courses, as per note above.
