2. How Do Innovators Think? (DSSP, SCIS)

BMGT 289B	Section 0201	W 3:00pm-4:50pm**	3 Credits
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*** Evening guest speakers and special events will be scheduled on Mondays from 6:30-9:15pm. It is expected that there will be 3-5 scheduled Monday evening sessions during the entire semester. Daytime meetings will be held every week.*

BMGT289B satisfies the (DSSP) and (SCIS) general education requirements.

3. Supporting Course(s) – *Optional for first and second semester*

Students may complete the one (1) required Support Course anytime during their first four (4) semesters. Please see the Scholars BSE citation sheet for a list of approved supporting courses.

For Spring, 2018: All BSE students must take **BMGT110S- Introduction to Business Value Chain** (*Restricted to College Park Scholars in Business, Society, and the Economy*) as part of the BSE curriculum requirement. They may also register for one of the required Supporting Courses, as per note above.

For Fall, 2019: All BSE students must take CPBE225-Enterprise Communication as part of the BSE curriculum requirement. CPBE225 satisfies the (FSOC) general education requirement. Please take this into consideration prior to registering for general education courses. They may also register for one of the required Supporting Courses, as per note above.
